



Maryknoll School, High School Division Student Registration Information ~ Class of 2009 (Distributed to Students)

The attached packet provides important information for registering for the 2008-09 school year:

NOTE: Mr. Kekaulike, College Guidance Director, or Mrs. Manlansing, College Guidance Counselor, will schedule an appointment to meet with each junior and will complete a College Guidance Meeting and Recommendations Form. A copy of this form will be given to the junior advisors who are assisting with students' credit check.

It is important to carefully read all instructions before completing the Course Selection Form. This will help to ensure a schedule that meets graduation requirements and provides opportunities for a successful senior year. Your advisor will hold on to the official (colored) Course Selection Form & RRCC chart until you are ready to finalize your courses and have your parents / guardians sign this form.

Completing the Course Selection Form & Record of Required Courses Completed Chart

- Write in your name, advisor's name and advisory ID number on the Course Selection Form. See your advisor for the advisory ID number.
- Transfer your grades from the unofficial transcript to the RRCC chart. Indicate using a **slash** through courses already completed, currently taking and to be completed by the end of the 2007-08 SY.
- **Circle** the next course in the sequence and to be taken in the 2008-09 SY.
- Write in the circled courses indicated on the RRCC chart on to the Course Selection Form. Be sure students indicate alternate focus and alternate elective courses to help build the best student schedule possible. The master schedule is generated from the student course requests.
- Complete the **colored** Course Selection Form and Record of Required Courses Completed and return to your advisor on this day, **February 25, 2008**, with a parent's or guardian's signature. Your unofficial transcripts and Mr. Kekaulike and Mrs. Manlansing's recommendations must also be attached to these forms.
- It is **highly recommended** that seniors sign up for Study I (901) in the 1st trimester to assist them in completing their Senior Project and Graduation Portfolio requirements. Individual college guidance counseling will also occur during the senior's study hall period.

Final Check-off List

- You must have 6 core and 6 elective courses. It is highly recommended that students select an English, Social Studies, Science and Math core.
 - An exception: If you take two or more AP courses, you may enroll in 2 elective AP courses in lieu of a core in the 3rd trimester, depending on the AP course.
- If you have a 3.5 or higher GPA, you are encouraged to enroll in AP courses. If you have a 3.0 to 3.5, consider an AP course in your strongest area. Other students interested in AP courses should discuss it with a teacher in that subject area. Some students may have also received an AP Potential Letter, identifying possible courses that they should consider enrolling in, which is based on students' PSAT scores.
 - AP Policy guideline: Juniors may sign up for only 1 AP course. In senior year, students can enroll in 2 AP courses after demonstrating their readiness by receiving a B in a previous AP course or a 3 on an AP exam. Students must enroll in the appropriate elective AP course or AP course that is offered in the 3rd trimester.
- Most seniors enroll in the **Biology B (324) and Ethics (714) link**. If they completed the UH Summer Scholars Biology class, then they can enroll in AP Biology (351) and Ethics (714).
- An advanced level language is highly recommended.
- The following class is required: **Maryknoll (715) or Maryknoll Mission Experience (790)**.

- Select the remaining electives. Be certain that these courses will help you meet your graduation requirements. Study Hall, PE, library or office assistant are considered electives. You may select an Open in the 2nd or 3rd trimesters but need parent permission and meet the Open policy requirements.

*Note: Forms submitted **AFTER** the assigned deadline will have a lower scheduling priority. A fee will be assessed for scheduling changes for courses not listed on the original Course Selection Form. While every effort is made to fulfill your requests, we cannot guarantee that they will all be met. The school reserves the right to provide each student with a course deemed equivalent to the ones selected.*
