



Maryknoll School, High School Division Student Registration Information ~ Class of 2010 (Distribute to student)

The attached packet provides important information for registering for the 2008-09 school year. If anything is missing, inform your advisor immediately. The packet includes:

It is important to carefully read all instructions before completing the Course Selection Form. This will help to ensure a schedule that meets graduation requirements and provides opportunities for a successful junior year. Your advisor will hold on to the official (colored) Course Selection Form & RRCC chart until you are ready to finalize your courses and have your parents / guardians sign this form.

Completing the Course Selection Form & Record of Required Courses Completed Chart

- Write in your name, advisor's name and advisory ID number on the Course Selection Form.
- Transfer your grades from the unofficial transcript to the colored RRCC chart. Indicate using a **slash** through courses already completed, currently taking and to be completed by the end of the 2007-08 SY.
- **Circle** the next course in the sequence and to be taken in the 2008-09 SY.
- Write in the circled courses indicated on the RRCC chart on the Course Selection Form. Be sure to indicate alternate focus and elective courses to help build the best student schedule possible, based on the master schedule that is generated from the course requests.
- Return the colored Course Selection Form, Record of Required Courses Completed and the unofficial transcripts with your parent's signature to your advisor on this day, _____.

Final Check-off list

- You should have 6 core and 6 elective courses selected. Be sure that you have selected alternates.
- If you have a 3.5 or higher GPA, you are encouraged to enroll in AP courses. If you have a 3.0 to 3.5, consider an AP course in your strongest area. Other students interested in AP courses should discuss it with a teacher in that subject area. Some students may have also received an AP Potential Letter, identifying possible courses that they should consider enrolling in, which is based on students' PSAT scores.
AP policy guideline: Juniors may sign up for only 1 AP course. In senior year, students can enroll in 2 AP courses after demonstrating their readiness by receiving a B in a previous AP course or a 3 on an AP exam.
- All juniors are required to register for **Writing for College (115)**.
- Most juniors enroll in **Chemistry B/Biology A (323)**. If you complete ChemB/BioA in summer school, be sure to register for the Biology B (324) and Ethics (714) courses.
- An advanced level language is highly recommended.
- Select your electives. Be certain that these courses will help you meet your graduation requirements. Study Hall, PE, Library and Office Assistants are considered electives.
By the end of junior year, you should have tried to fulfill one or two fine arts electives, possibly a religion elective, and possibly PE III.

Note: Forms submitted AFTER the assigned deadline will have a lower scheduling priority. A fee will be assessed for scheduling changes for courses not listed on the original Course Selection Form. While every effort is made to fulfill your requests, we cannot guarantee that they will all be met. The school reserves the right to provide each student with a course deemed equivalent to the ones selected.
