1 World Literature I Req'd Core English	111	An interdisciplinary thematic course which surveys world literature from its earliest emergence to the European Renaissance (1500 CE) and is linked with World History I (211).
2 World History I Req'd Core Social Studies	211	World History I is an essay based, thematic course linked to World Literature I (111). Students are challenged to analyze and re-imagine important events, people, places, ideas and problems of world history from preliterate times to the present. Some topics in this course will focus on the role and impact of technology on history and the search for understanding.
3 Physics Req'd Core Science	311	This course will identify and explain the classical laws of mechanics and their wide range of applications. Students will gather qualitative and quantitative data, interpret them scientifically, draw conclusions from their observations and justify their assertions within the context of scientific method.

5 World Literature II Req'd Core English	112	An interdisciplinary thematic course which surveys world literature from the European Renaissance to the present and is linked with World History II (212).
6 World History II Req'd Core Social Studies	212	World History II is an essay based, thematic course linked with World Literature II (112). Topics in this course are centered around the themes of "Values and Beliefs" and "Diversity, Conflict and Justice" throughout world history.
7 Creativity Req'd Elective Fine Arts	611	Exploring the many possibilities of the creative personality.
8 Intro to Catholic Christianity Req'd Elective Religious Studies	711	Freshmen course that investigates Catholic Christianity through the meaning of faith, and our roots in tradition and the sacraments.
9 Christian Morality Req'd Elective Religious Studies	718	Freshmen course that provides the student with the opportunity to study and apply an effective moral decision-making process to his/her personal life.
10 PE I Req'd Elective PE	811	PE1 focuses on basic movements, rules, teamwork, team competition and physical conditioning of the various team sports. (basketball, volleyball, flag football, soccer, baseball)
11 Freshman Seminar Req'd Freshman Elective	911	A required course for all 9 th graders to take during 1 st trimester. Students will be given basic technology training along with important social and academic skills they need to succeed in high school.
